




UCAS = Universities & Colleges Admissions Service

Deal with the majority of full-time applications for Higher Education degrees

Completely independent of all universities

- £13 for 1 choice
- £24 for up to 5 choices








UCAS Track

- Track your application status (UCAS Track service)
- Once students have applied they can use UCAS track to log in and check status of all their choices/applications
- Universities will update decisions via UCAS track and offer detail can be viewed too
- Reply to your offers
- Edit address/email details after sending important to make sure you have these up to date (up until the start of university so universities can contact you!)
- Add new choices (if all 5 have not been used)







You reply to offers

FIRM - First choice and where you intend to go

INSURANCE = Second choice
(normally lower entry requirements)

- These are binding, and not designed for you to switch between
- You reply by early May
- You must have all your decisions back from all your choices before you can decide (end March)

If you do not reply UCAS may automatically decline all your offers!



Results day

- Following exam results all decisions will be updated via UCAS track check there first
- If a student has been successful in being accepted the offer will change to unconditional – this could be unconditional firm or insurance
- If firm choice conditions are met this is where the student is going. Insurance choice only comes into play if the student misses their firm choice conditions (and is therefore rejected by that university)
- If student misses all conditions (or they decide they no longer want the offers)
 they will be entered into UCAS clearing





15 October – Medicine, Dentistry, Veterinary Medicine, Oxford and Cambridge deadline

15 January - application deadline for all other courses

31 March - all universities must reply to your application with a decision

Early May - you reply to your offers (Firm and Insurance)

Early August - SQA Higher Results and updates on UCAS track. Registration with the university directly usually follows about two weeks after this.

Early September - begin university!

UCAS Extra - March - June

Clearing – from 5th July for students who have no offers or opt out of all their offers

Don't forget your student finance application and student accommodation applications too!






Applying to the University of Glasgow

- Over 700 single & joint honours degrees
- Flexible degree structure
- Range of professional degrees

S5 Standard Requirements:	Higher grades required by the end of S5 for a guaranteed offer*
S5 Minimum	the minimum Higher grades required by the end of S5 to be
Requirements:	considered for an offer
S6 Requirements:	the cumulative grades required by the end of S6 for conditional offer holders
Additional Requirements:	subject requirements/admissions tests/interviews/personal statement etc. (different for each course)

^{*}Additional requirements must be met/passed for an offer to be possible.

Applicants leaving care and those from target postcode areas (and schools) may be eligible for an adjusted offer. If you believe this applies to you, please visit our website for further information www.glasgow.ac.uk/wideningparticipation



Professional degree programmes have very specific personal statement requirements (eg. Dentistry at UofG – must have 3 days work experience at dental practice)

Where you are applying to a professional course write your personal statement for that



Personal Statement

- Be truthful
- Emphasise skills & suitability
- Emphasise achievements & experiences (extra curricular)
- Keep it relevant and <u>personal</u>
- Can be broad for flexible degrees
- Can include other subjects


