Our school hosted a number of events as part of Scottish Apprenticeship Week, a national campaign to highlight the benefits of entering the workforce through apprenticeship pathways.





The Thales session was led by three former pupils who offered an insight into the aerospace industry as well as engaging our pupils in some fun, interactive STEM activities.









Next up was healthcare. Many of our young people aim to work in this sector, so we were particularly pleased to welcome Noelle Mackay, from NHSGGC, to work for Scotland's biggest apprenticeship opportunities.

Many of our young people aim to work in the construction industry on leaving school and this was reflected in the numbers of pupils who attended this session over one hundred. Dennie Gillespie, from **Morrison Construction,** gave invaluable advice as to how to succeed in the sector, particularly when applying for an apprenticeship post school.

Our sports development pupils have been trained in leadership opportunities and are currently completing placements in all 7 of our associated primary schools.








## **English**

Miss Sloan is really proud of their consistent hard work in preparation for N5 next year!




They independently chose the image, identified the techniques used and annotated the advert with the effects of each technique.










#### **Public Speaking Competition**








# Maths Club
